NDP Response: Quality End of Life Care Coalition

1. Does your party support an integrated palliative approach to care in all settings of health care?

New Democrats have a bold vision to expand health services to provide head to toe coverage. As part of this vision, New Democrats believe that people who seek help should receive dignified and compassionate care during all stage of illness and end of life care.

We support expanding an integrated palliative approach to care so that people may receive palliative support in the comfort of their home, in a hospice, or elsewhere.
