### **Indigenous Connections Social Worker**

The Indigenous Connections Social Worker promotes and develops the capacity of families and Aboriginal communities to provide for the safety and well-being of children and youth, as well as support relational and cultural stability. This is achieved through seeking out and involving extended family (kin and others) and communities, focusing on Aboriginal communities, to achieve stability and connection, leading to healing and well-being for children and youth receiving services from MCFD.

The Indigenous Connections Social Worker supports social workers who have primary case responsibility to ensure that the right people are brought together to collectively plan, make decisions and commit to actions that ensure the well-being of Aboriginal children, youth, families and communities. Using your ability to handle changing situations, emerging priorities and challenging deadlines, you will work collaboratively with other policy teams and regional staff, cross-ministry partners and stakeholders on children and youth with special needs projects and policy development.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Bachelors or Master's Degree in Social Work or Child and Youth Care, or Masters of Educational Counselling or Masters of Clinical Psychology having completed a practicum in family and child welfare; or equivalent.  
**NOTE:** if your degree was obtained outside of Canada, you need to confirm it has been assessed for equivalency through the International Credential Evaluation Services (ICES). Confirmation of equivalency for your degree is required for you to be considered. Please indicate in your resume (copy and paste a copy of the approval; if in progress, proof must be provided on or by the closing date of the posting).
- A minimum of 6 months experience working with Indigenous communities' spiritual, emotional, physical and mental well-being
